CANCELLING INTEREST GROUP RESERVATIONS

If you've signed up for an Interest Group event, please remember to cancel your reservation if you are unable to attend. Our hostesses plan for a certain number of attendees, particularly when preparing food or procuring items for a gathering. It's discouraging when members make a reservation and subsequently don't attend or don't pay for the event if there was a

subsequently don't attend or don't pay for the event if there was a charge. Remember, there could be a waiting list so someone may be able to fill your spot.

Here are 3 different ways you can cancel a reservation:

From your computer. On the TLWC website, click on Calendar on the top black bar and then click on the event. Scroll down and click on "Already Registered" and a screen pops up with the event details. Scroll down and click "Cancel Reservation". It will then ask you to confirm your cancellation.

From your cell phone. Click on "My Tickets" at bottom of screen. Click on the event you want to cancel; scroll down to "RSVP" and click on the "Cancel" button.

Contact the hostess or hostesses by phone or text so they know you won't be able to attend. Please don't contact them by email. Our hostesses are often busy preparing for an event and may not have the opportunity to check their emails.

GIVING BACK TO OUR COMMUNITY, SAVING LIVES

"Over the past three years", according to TLWC member Carol Costakis, "TLWC has had great success with Hand-Only CPR training. In partnership with Monument Fire District and UC Health, we have taught CPR to over 75 members and spouses. We've learned that guick actions by strangers and having an AED (automated external defibrillator) on-site can be lifesaving."

And so, taking these life-saving training sessions one step further, Carol and Jan McKinley spearheaded the purchase of an AED to be placed in a site where so many TLWC events take place – in the Woodmoor Barn. As Jan stated, "Our ability to use the Barn enables more members to attend events in a great location - at no cost. Putting an AED in the Barn, operated by Woodmoor Improvement Association (WIA)

gives TLWC the opportunity to

show our appreciation."

GRANT COMMITTEE

The TLWC Grant Committee met on March 28 to review 25 applications totaling more than \$55,000. After careful consideration, the committee selected a slate of 17 applicants to receive a total of \$30,000. The recommendations will be presented to the membership at the April luncheon and voting will take place in May.

BY-LAW CHANGE PROPOSAL

It was brought to the attention of the board that we have two different voting practices in the by-laws. To uphold consistency in voting we propose to vote to change the by-law as follows. Please understand that this is **not a change to the membership dues** only a change to how we vote on changes to membership dues.

We want to vote to change the by-laws to state:

Article III Section 2, B

Any change in the amount of membership dues shall be approved by the membership at any regular business meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting, as long as a quorum of 25% of the membership is present. Notice of a proposed dues change must be provided at least three weeks prior to a vote. Any dues change will take effect in the next Fiscal Year.

Current language: approved by a majority of the membership

A second By-law change was proposed by the CIA/SOS Committee to change the name.

Article VII Section 1, H

The Community & Member Outreach committee provides members the opportunity to engage in community service projects, and provides encouragement and support to TLWC members' needs as they arise.

Current language: Caring in Action (CIA) is responsible for providing members with volunteer opportunities for assisting the community. Serving our Sisters (SOS) is a service responsible for alerting our members and their immediate families to other members' needs.

TYPES OF ITEMS ACCEPTED:

- First, only donate items that are in great condition and would appeal to our members and their friends.
- If anything donated is precious or unique, please provide documentation to prove value or description of authenticity, or describe item and perhaps where it originated. This must be turned in along with the item, in writing, at the time of the donation at The Barn. Forms will be provided.
- Think space; we only have THE BARN to display items and put on the event. Items need to be able to sit on a table, small space on the floor or lean against a table or pillar if larger.
- Home décor items that are of current style. If you can find it at a place like Michaels, Hobby Lobby, Kirkland's or better type of store, upscale consignment, or gallery we want it!
- Current, working and in great condition small appliances. Examples;
 Instapot, Soda stream, spa type of appliances, KitchenAid mixers, etc.
- Wall art such as non-faded, framed prints, watercolors, oils, etc.
- Table art such as bronzes, non-faded and clean floral arrangements, statuary, beautiful vases, glass figures, etc.
- Smaller antiques if you think they would appeal to the audience and sell.
- Designer and in great condition hand bags.
- Popular books in good condition. These will be put into lots.
- Pottery in great condition; either functionable pottery or art pottery.
- Dish sets in great condition; either vintage or current.
- Crystal or glass sets in great condition.
- Small, accent furniture pieces.
- Jewelry in sets, or those that can be put into lots from items donated. Must be styles appealing to members or friends.
- Sports equipment in great condition; pickle ball, tennis, bicycles, small fitness equipment, etc.
- Donated vacation weeks; personal property, timeshares with fees already paid, etc. Must have good descriptions, be current for the remaining year or beyond and be authentic.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

- Items torn, broken, faded, not in good working order.
- Items that are too large to display.
- Large furniture items.
